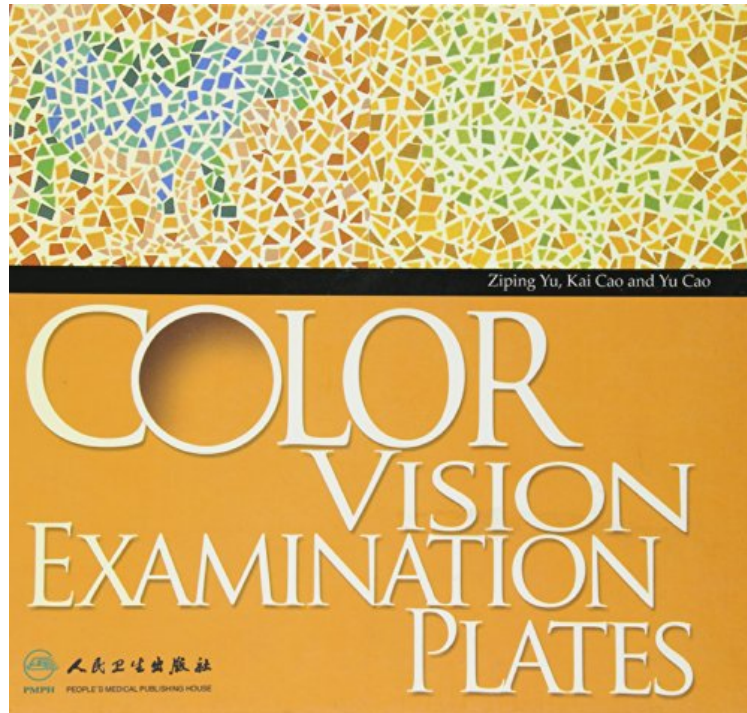

0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. Chinese color vision test. By Jerry Denim This is one of the favored color vision tests still used in China. I was asked to identify the shapes, numbers, objects, animals etc in this book by the CAAC aeromedical office in Beijing. I could be wrong, but it appears to be a (perhaps deliberately) incomplete edition. The test book I was presented with in Beijing had many of the exact same plates, but the colors seemed to vary quite a bit. A few of the test plates I was presented with appeared more saturated and therefore easier than the same plate in my copy of the book which I acquired from . Others seemed different but in a way that made them more difficult to see. I wasn't allowed to touch the book or let alone count the pages that were literally falling out of a very worn book with a broken spine, but it looked as if the book they use for actual testing in China has more than the 66 plates in this edition. Despite being extremely familiar with this book (memorized backwards, forwards and upside-down.) I was still stumped by a plate that I swear I had never seen before and another which I thought I knew but apparently gave the wrong answer to. Beware, do not think you can memorize this test and pass a Chinese color vision test. They have plates that are not in this book or the colors are off enough to make them appear entirely different. [\*Side note to those who may have Chinese career aspirations\*] After I missed two out of about twenty-five plates instead of being sent home right away, the CAAC doctors surprised me by asking me to read from a Ishihara book. I was shown one of the red-green anomaly trick plates (you see one number if you're color normal but a different number if you're color deficient.) and I gave the wrong answer. Game over. I had heard that Ishihara's are not used in China but apparently they are used on occasion as an alternative. I wish I had known and been more prepared. Good

luck to any color defectives out there. Baseless and illogical discrimination is hard to bear but there are ways around anything with a little luck and a lot of legwork.

Color blindness or color weakness affects about 5 per cent of the world's population, and testing for color blindness is increasing important, as many occupations require good color vision now.
