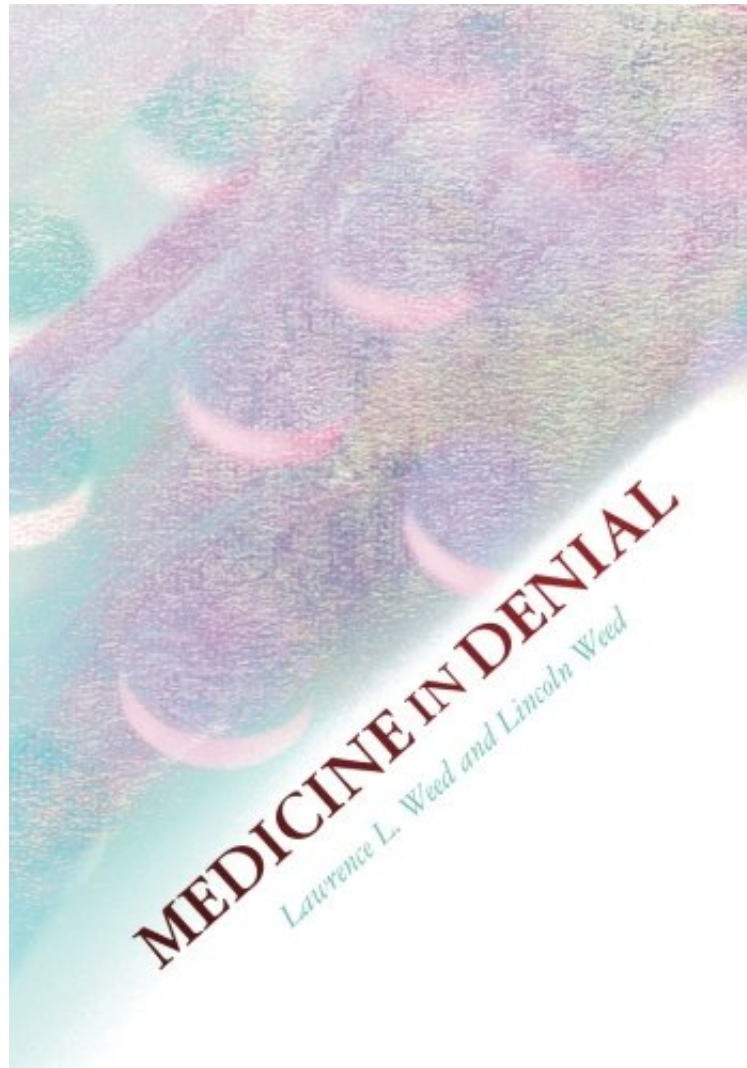

I had been a city planner for 7 years, and then entered a program to train as a Family Nurse Practitioner at Yale. My job in NYC was the development of computerization of the draft capital budget along with the input of the areas citizens. I combined this with Dr Weed's medical record approach (which is now used universally), his insistence of the necessity of computerization, and the announcement of the "Apple 2". Bingo! The most important message in medicine By John Martin Wehlou Dr Weed has pointed to the central problem in medicine for close to half a century now, and, frankly, nothing has changed. The unwillingness, or incapacity, of doctors and implementers of software for medicine, to understand and act on this message, is breathtaking. To understand what the issues are, I'd recommend watching Dr Weed's lecture from 1971 (search for "Weed", "Internal medicine", "lecture" on youtube), then proceed to reading this book.

Deep disorder pervades medical practice. Disguised in euphemisms like "clinical judgment" and "evidence-based medicine," disorder exists because medical practice lacks a true system of care. The missing system has two core elements: standards of care for managing clinical information, and electronic information tools designed to implement those standards. Electronic information tools are now widely discussed, but the necessary standards of care are still widely ignored.

About the Author Lawrence L. Weed is a physician who, more than 50 years ago, originated influential standards for organizing medical records. He applied these standards (known as the problem-oriented medical record) in designing electronic record systems. He subsequently developed software tools for applying medical knowledge to patient data. His son Lincoln practiced employee benefits law in Washington, D.C. for 26 years and now specializes in health privacy at a consulting firm.
