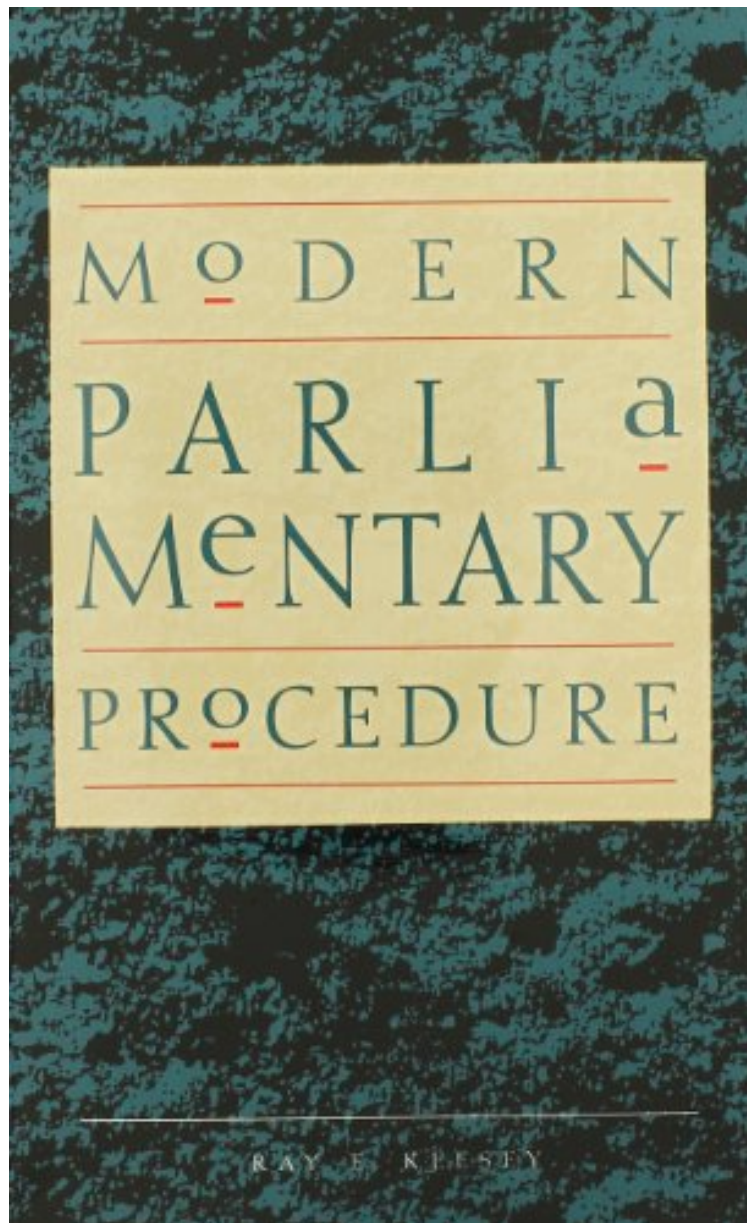

Keeseey takes Robert's Rules and strips away a lot of obscure and arcane complexity, arriving at a useful set of parliamentary procedures that are especially well-suited to small and medium-sized groups. The mystique of parliamentary maneuvers is removed in favor of a logical approach that protects rights without losing sight of the goal: to get things done with a minimum of confusion and unnecessary delay. Keeseey explains which motions are needed and why the obscure ones he rejects won't be missed by the great majority of organizations. (Do you really accomplish anything by having a motion seconded? If not, then why do it??) He also explains the framework of parliamentary actions, ranging from the duties of a chairperson to the parliamentary rights of ex officio committee members (a topic that is widely misunderstood). Many examples are given to illustrate proper and improper procedures. If you need a parliamentary authority for your organization (unless it's on the scale of a national political convention or a state legislature), consider Keeseey's recommendations seriously.

This is a manual of the traditionally complex and overly technical rules of parliamentary procedure. It modernises terminology, presents a logical classification of motions, and provides ideas for the prevention and handling of disruptions.
