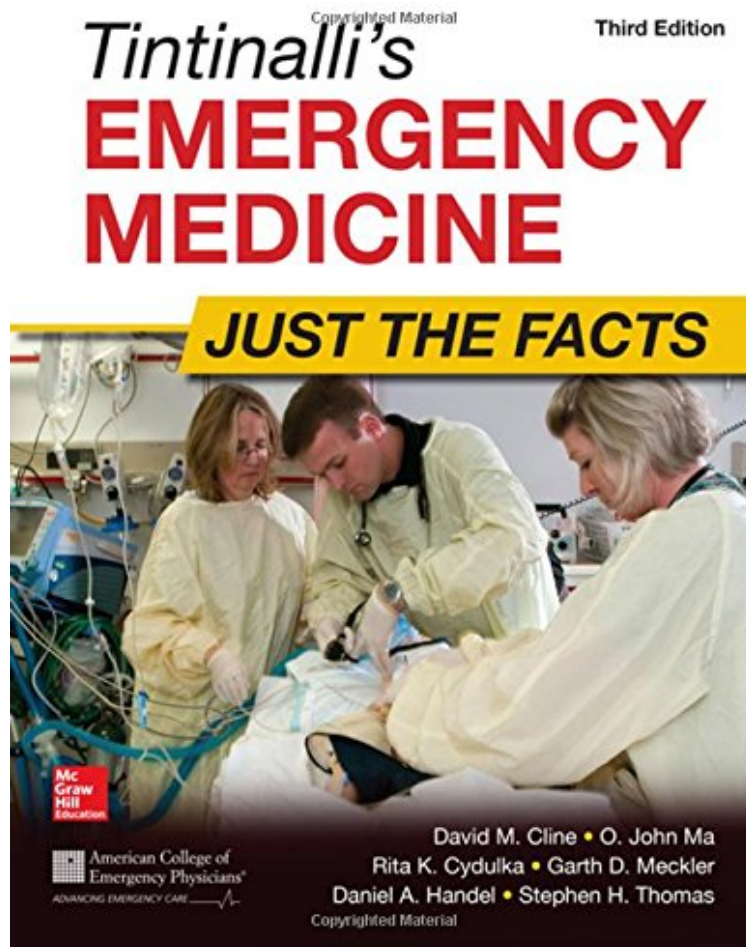

Medicine, but the full sized Comprehensive Study Guide is not easily portable and sometimes provides far more detail than is necessary to answer a question. That is where Just The Facts excels. It is an easy to reference, more easily transportable, condensed version of the original that provides all the required information for recognition, diagnosis and treatment in an Emergency Medicine setting. That said, the Kindle version of this book is impossible to use. The text formatting makes reading difficult, even when using an iPad or the computer App, the tables are formatted in either a much larger font than the rest of the text, or a font so small that they cannot be read. There are a large number of incorrectly spelled words, inappropriately inserted hyphens and transposed letters. The overall quality of the text is something that I would be hard pressed to live with in a free copy, and charging over \$60 for a product with quality that is this low is absurd.
