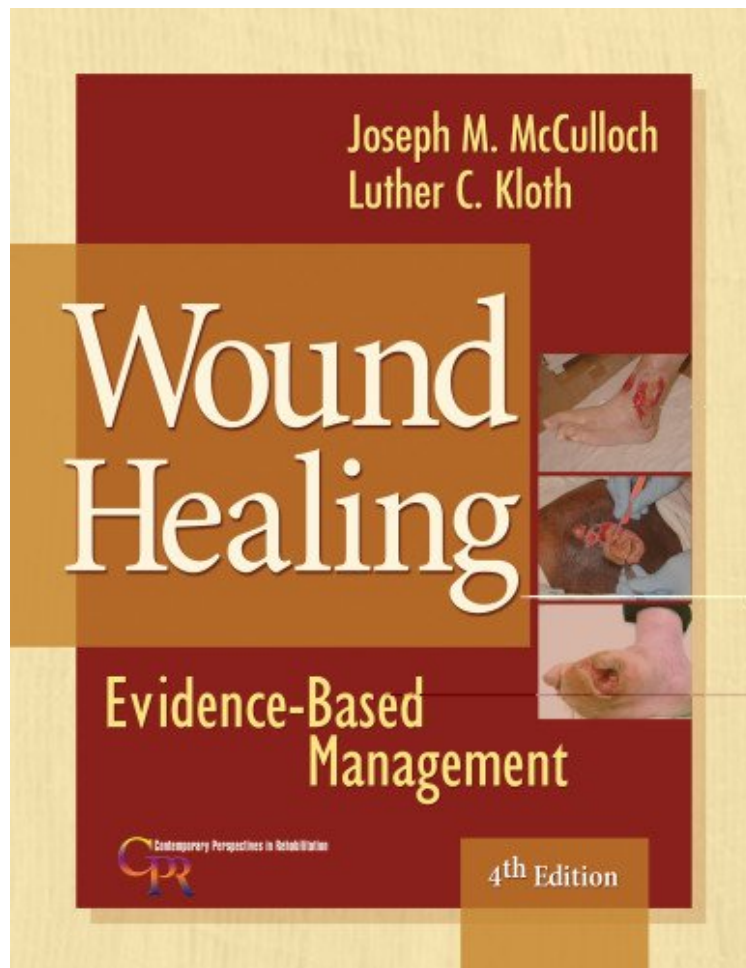

For those of you who are serious about learning the real stuff, at a more advanced level, this is the book. So much emphasis is placed on staging pressure wounds, keeping a wound moist, what products to buy, etc., etc. What is really important to learn is how

wounds actually heal, then all of the other stuff will fall into place.(Chapter 2 "The Wound Healing Process") There are important phases of healing that mean everything but often there is little taught about them. Ever hear the saying "treat the whole patient and not the hole in the patient"? This book has that covered too. (Part II "Assessing the patient") For those of you ready to go the next step of getting patient access to real wound care, this book will also help you.
