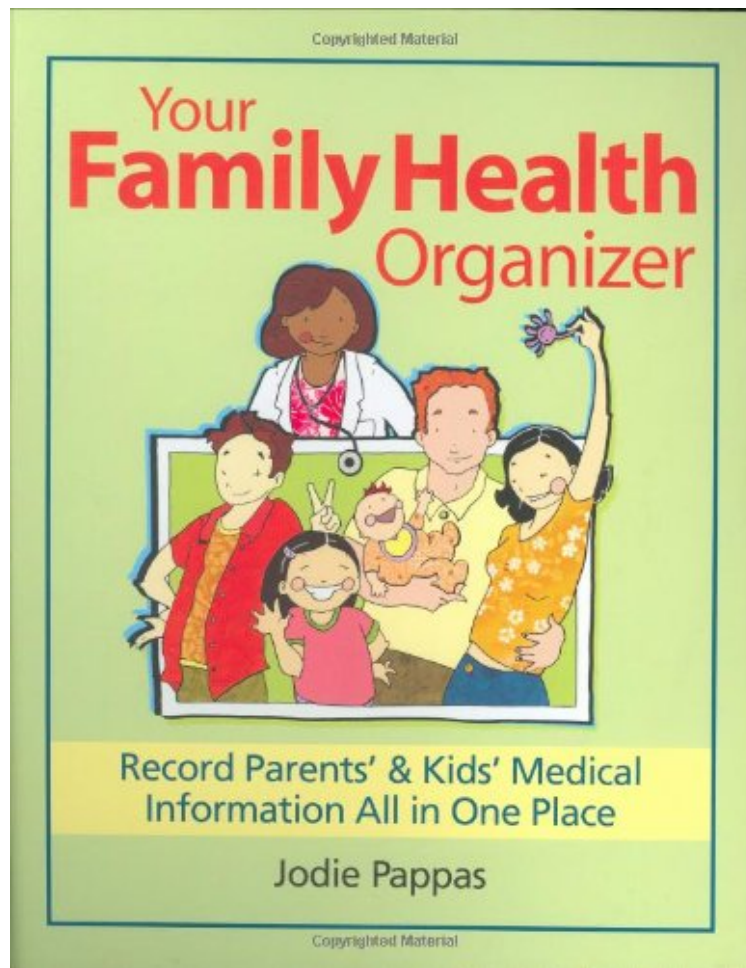

Pros: It provides a place and format to keep and organize medical records. It's very helpful to have a designated place for medical records. Cons: Although the small size of the binder is good for travel purposes, that small size is a huge problem when most of the paperwork from the doctor's office is 8.5" x 11". There are too many papers to just fold them because it becomes too bulky, and it's harder to find paperwork

when it's folded. In hindsight, I should have chosen a full size binder. Having medical information for the whole family in one place is actually inconvenient. When I bring one child to the doctor, I don't want or need to carry medical information for the entire family. Loose papers are not easily accommodated. The format does not lend well to organizing and tracking medical information for ongoing medical conditions. 1 of 1 people found the following review helpful. I would suggest "pockets", inside front and back covers OR clear plastic sleeves be added inside the binder for storing/adding loose items or documentation to support what has been recorded on the inside. ONE BIG DISAPPOINTMENT! This item is a THREE RING BINDER. The rings are plastic, TOO SMALL for the number of pages and they have poor quality SPRINGS thus allowing the rings to randomly pop open/separate and allow the pages to fall out. My daughter has multiple health conditions that require us to see specialists, and I have had some medical issues, so it has been very useful for us. It is mid-sized, which makes carrying it to appointments easier, but it does require that you buy special refill pages. It is nice because there are separate sections for multiple children. Some of the sections could use more pages or room to write, but overall there is adequate space to record things. I wanted a ready-made organizer that I could start using immediately, and this fits the bill.

I am really not an organized person, so I am excited about using Your Family Health Organizer binder by Jodie Pappas to help get myself more prepared. This is a 3 ring binder with tabbed sections for 2 adults and 3 children. Each section has a pocket for any special prescriptions or papers that you need to keep handy. Plus there are checklists for medications, medical history, dental, eye and ear records. For the children there are growth charts and checklists for developmental milestones. Each section has a page for family history and records of doctors visits and appointments. At the back of the binder, there are plastic pockets for insurance and social security cards, plus a larger ziploc type bag that I may use for birth certificates. Each of the pages are hole punched so you can easily remove them as needed. If your child has special prescriptions or medical directions that need to be followed, you can take the page out and leave it with a care giver or school nurse.
